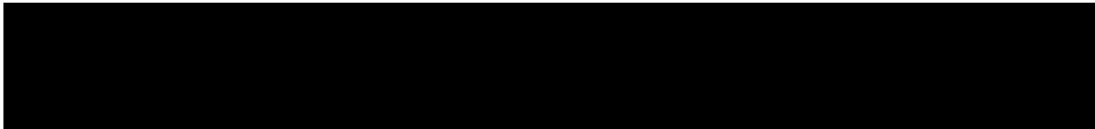

**Subject:** Eileen Willmott's comments on 2021/3225/P. Murphy's Yard



Dear Planners,

I have lived in Dartmouth Park since 1967, am on the DPCAAC, DPNF and have been a Heath Hand for over 20 years. I trained as a botanist and have had a career in biology.

I welcome a wildlife biodiversity corridor from the south of the site, linking it to the Heath in the north, the 'Heath Line'. However, this must be continuous for wildlife, including plants, by dispersal mechanisms, and animals to travel across, not just a walkway for people.

I have read Arbeco Limited's Arboricultural Impact Assessment (AIA) and understand that there are 57 individual trees on site and 20 groups of trees; 22 of these trees and 12 of the groups are Category B, whereas 35 individual trees and 8 groups are category C. I understand that 6 individual trees and 3 partial groups will have to be removed, all Category B, and 5 will need to be pruned. 24 trees could sustain damage to their canopies and 42 trees could sustain damage to their Root Protection Areas (RPAs). I ask that Camden does monitor the works to make sure that they comply with BS5837 (2012) and that there will be a robust re-planting scheme to ensure adequate green spaces occur, especially in the housing areas of the site.
