Good morning,

Re. planning app'n 2022/0419/T, we would like to object to the removal of ANY healthy trees in the south of the borough, especially these beautiful, life-supporting plane trees overlooking the EES.

As residents nearby with no trees in our road and heavy, stationary traffic - buses, lorries, vans (Southampton Row) - we open our windows rarely in order to try to mitigate the greasy, sticky particles and dust settling inside our home. The effect of breathing this 'air' is similar to passive smoking, a habit not encouraged by anyone but planners, it seems. The only compensation residents can enjoy is in the form of green spaces and trees in the locality. Not in the twee, contrived new green spaces popping up in the borough but in the vicinity of and under the canopy of these towering organisms which contribute so much to improving air-quality and mental health wellbeing. Camden should be planting them in their dozens on A-roads in the area rather than cementing over their bases and roots, pollarding them (a not-so-healthy practice abandoned in many parts of the EU) and spending time on this application by EES to destroy two of them.

Perhaps, if the location doesn't suit, it is the EES members who should consider relocating?
