				 The scale, height and overall bulk of the two towers sited adjacent to the riding arena at the farm are out of scale with the surroundings and will be detrimental to the immediate surroundings. They contravene Policy D3 design Principles of the Kentish Town Neighbourhood plan which clearly states developments ¿must be well integrated into their surroundings and reinforce and enhance the local character¿. The towers have been sited as close to the railway and therefore the Farm so that they are outside the protected viewing cone of Parliament hill and a view of trees from the designated point outside the Kentish Town Station, However one tower does encroach, the other may just fall outside the viewing cone. This view is defined in Policy D1 of the KTNF plan and also Policy SP2a (1). The location of the towers directly overlooks the riding arena, which is often used for programs run for vulnerable young adults and children as well as disabled participants. This poses a real problem for the farm to provide adequate safeguarding to those that are taking part in these programs who may well be affected by the fact of being overlooked.
