				The proposal is to open up two windows that had been previously bricked over which will have a significant impact on the privacy of the garden at the rear of Hampstead Hill Mansions and in particular the private garden belonging to Flat 9. Camden Planning Guidance Amenity dated January 2021 notes that gardens at the rear of residential buildings should have their privacy respected.
				It is intended to install an air source heat pump but this will create noise from the outdoor fan and without restrictions on noise level and/or noise attenuation will have a significant impact on Flat 9 and in particular use of the conservatory. Ground source pumps would not have the same noise implications and would be preferred.
