				While it is noted that the proposed basement is within the existing building footprint, to convert a cellar into a basement involves an intensification of use & excavation which is considered inappropriate in the area with consequent disruption to the adjoining property.	
				The lightwell at the front is considered unnecessary given that the proposed use of the front basement is for a cinema/TV room, but if it is accepted, the metal grille proposed is unsightly & inappropriate to buildings in Aberdare Gardens. It extends over a substantial part of the front garden. This should be replace by walk on glass as proposed at the rear.	
				The application refers to 'porcelain paving' & 'glazed porcelain tiles' being laid to replace the existing concrete surface. Porcelain is an impermeable material & this is at odds with the reference in the basement impact assessment to laying 'permeable paving' . As the assessment points out, this is essential to minimise surface water run off & should be a condition.	
				Removal of trees & shrubs in the conservation area is a matter of grave concern. While it is noted from the arboricultural report that the trees to be removed are of little value they nonetheless provide a vital wildlife habitat. The offending specimens should be pollarded or doctored wherever possible. No details are provided of the trees & shrubs proposed to replace them but 'full details are to be confirmed'. It is imperative that the Council imposes conditions requiring full details to be provided & approved prior to work commencing & then monitors all tree removals, checks that roots are properly ground out and polices the site after development to ensure that new tree specimens replace all trees lost.
