Additionally they will only have a single staircase for access and escape. Its as if no one has bothered learning the lessons from Grenfell at all. 5000+ new residents in the area is a massive shift. For reference this is the same population of the town of Chalfont St. Giles. This is 6 to 7 times higher than the average density in camden for other developments. Not only will this create a number of issues in terms of safety (fire and ambulance emergency services access) it will also add pressure on local schools, hospitals, doctors, dentists, transport, energy infrastructure and utilities. None of which has been accounted for in the impact planning.</p> <p>This development doesn't even attempt to manage sustainability issues and hasn't considered energy use at all.</p> <p>The claims on green space are a fallacy because they are based on an assumption that the developers are able to acquire land they don't own. As soon as they get permission this will be the first aspect they drop (based on previous experience with the failed Ballymore planning control)</p> <p>There is evidence that this density of housing is detrimental to mental health.</p> <p>So what you've created is an unsafe, high impact, high density, stupidly tall new town without any consideration for existing surrounding population or the services required to support the population of a town. I suggest this needs a radical rethink.</p>

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
