Assessment

The s.211 notification if for the removal of a purple plum from the rear garden of a residential block that is situated within the Belsize Park Conservation Area.

The tree is of minimal visibility from the public realm. The tree is not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The tree is small in size and is growing in close proximity to larger trees. The tree is not of a rare species and is of no known cultural or historic value. The tree is not considered to be a noteworthy example of its species.

The tree may provide some degree of screening between properties but this is considered limited given its position.

Submission of evidence is not a validation requirement of a s.211 notification.

It is not expedient for the council to serve a tree preservation order to protect the tree.

The council does not object to the proposed works.
