- where your completed questionnaire, yours and the appellant's statements and future comments can be inspected;
- that they may attend the hearing and, at the Inspector's discretion, give their views;
- that the decision will be published on the Planning Portal;
- what facilities are available for people with disabilities e.g. parking spaces, access and seating arrangements etc.

You should send a copy of this letter and a list of those notified to the case officer.

If you consider it appropriate, please notify the press of the hearing and, if notice of the hearing is published in the press, send a copy of the notice(s) to the case officer.

Please note that disabled people who may be concerned about facilities at the venue have been advised to write or contact the Council to confirm that proper provisions are in place.
