I would like to register my objection to Central and Cecil Housing Association insurer's request to fell two established trees in the garden of **102-104 Albert Street, NW1** - **Planning Application reference: 2022/1187/T** along with many of my neighbours and echo the majority of those who have already contacted you with this email.

The back gardens of the homes on the north side of Delancey Street, the north-east side of Albert Street and the north-west side of Arlington Road all create a unique and invaluable habitat for wildlife, which has particularly been valuable during the harsh times of the pandemic and created such comfort when there wasn't much to enjoy. I have lived in Albert Street for more than 16 years, and along with many of my neighbours and local residents, the value of this green space at the back of these properties not only provides an oasis of calm in the heart of Camden Town with its excessive noise and pollution, it adds so much beauty to the area. In fact, it is one of the huge pleasures of living where we all do.

The trees named in this planning application are listed and deserve protection. Furthermore, the trees are located some distance from the buildings of 102-104 Albert Street and will cause much distress and disruption to those living in this part of the street. While judicious pruning might be appropriate, to

remove these highly valued trees is not only unnecessary, but their loss would have a serious impact not only to our views and the tranquil atmosphere of this small oasis, but on the biodiversity and air quality of the area.

The people in this residential area of Camden Town have already lost too many mature trees in recent years and I very much hope that consent for this application will be declined.
