I wish to register my objection to *Central and Cecil Housing Association* insurer's request to fell two established trees in the garden of **102 - 104 Albert Street, NW1** - **Planning Application reference: 2022/1187/T**

The back gardens of the houses on the north side of *Delancey Street*, the north-east side of *Albert Street* and the north-west side of *Arlington Road* collectively create a unique and invaluable habitat for wildlife. I have lived in Delancey Street for over twenty two years and like many of my neighbours and local residents, the value of this green space at the back of our houses and flats not only provides an oasis of calm right in the centre of Camden Town with its noise and pollution, it adds immeasurably to the beauty of the area. In fact, it is one of the main pleasures of living where we do.

The trees named in this planning application are listed and as such deserve protection. Furthermore, the trees are located some distance from the buildings of **102 - 104 Albert Street**. While judicious pruning might be appropriate, to remove these highly valued trees is not only unnecessary, but their loss would have a serious impact not only to our views and the tranquil atmosphere of this small oasis, but on the biodiversity and air quality of the area.

The people in this residential area of Camden Town have already lost too many mature trees in recent years and I very much hope that consent for this application will be declined.
