#### Re. Extension to 14 New End Square

To whom it may concern,

I write to request an amendment to our planning permission for 14 New End Square.

### Context:

14 New End Square is part of a short terrace of 3 or 4 houses on the west side of the roughly triangular-shaped New End Square. The two adjacent properties also on the west side of the square – nos. 16 and 18 – are both listed buildings, however no. 14 is not listed.

In 2002 a symmetrical 'double-pitched' roof extension for nos. 14 and 16 was approved. Due to the elaborate nature of the design, the planning permission was agreed only on the basis that both no. 14 and no.16 were constructed together. The proposed roof extensions to no. 14 and no. 16 were never constructed for either side and the planning permission lapsed.

In November 2021, Dominic McKenzie Architects were granted planning for a revised version of this scheme. We write to request a minor amendment to the proposed dormer window on the front facade.

## Proposal:

The proposed change is a minor amendment to the proposed window on the front façade. This would involve a small increase in the width of the window, so that it matches the inner pane of the window below. It is a minor change to the previous approval which would not affect the streetscape, and would provide a great improvement of the quality of the interior space for our clients. The previously approved front window is rather modest given the scale of the roof and neighbouring dormer windows. This amendment would bring the window in line with the dormer windows above no. 18 New End Square.
