I am writing to object to the above application by Central and Cecil Housing Association's insurer's to fell two mature trees in the garden at 102-104 Albert Street, NW1. I live at 112 Albert Street, on the same side of the road as 102 and only four houses away.

These trees are some distance from the building, and as such felling, as distinct perhaps from some pruning, seems very unnecessary. The trees form part of a most valuable green space formed by the back gardens of Albert Street, Arlington Road, Delancey Street and Parkway. Visitors to my house always marvel at how calm this space seems, despite its proximity to the heavy traffic on Parkway and Camden High Street. The gardens contribute highly to biodiversity and improved air quality in this residential area. Loss of these trees would very adversely affect the view and the peaceful atmosphere for the many local residents.

Many local trees have been lost in this part of Camden in recent years, and I fervently hope that this application will be denied.
