## Town and Country Planning Acts 1990 (as amended) NOTIFICATION OF AN APPEAL

Shop And Premises 40 Gray's Inn Road London WC1X 8LR

The Council has been notified of an appeal against the enforcement notice **EN20/1065**, which has been made to the Planning Inspectorate.

The appeal concerns the Council's decision to issue an enforcement notice in relation to the following breaches of planning control:

Without planning permission:

- the installation of 3 x air conditioning units in the rear courtyard,
- the installation of a new shopfront.

The Council considers that the works are unacceptable on following grounds:

- In absence of an acoustic survey and noise assessment, given the close proximity to habitable rooms, the cumulative impact of the units give rise to potentially unacceptable levels of noise and disturbance detrimental to the neighbouring residents' amenity contrary to policies A1 (Managing the Impact of Development) and A4 (Noise and Vibration) of the Camden Local Plan (2017).
- the replacement shopfront, by reason of the inappropriate design and materials, is harmful to the character and appearance of the host building and the architectural and townscape significance of the locally listed terrace (nos. 38 to 54) of which the unit forms part, contrary to policy D1 (Design) and D2 (Heritage) of the Council's Local Plan adopted in 2017.
- In the absence of dynamic thermal modelling to demonstrate the need for the 3 x air conditioning units, the Council cannot be satisfied that the proposed works are necessary and

that appropriate climate adaptation measures to reduce the impact of overheating could not be achieved by other preferred measures as set out in the cooling hierarchy proposal is therefore contrary to Policy CC2 (Adapting to climate change) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

## **Grounds of Appeal**

The appellant/s have appealed on the following grounds:

Ground (a): That planning permission should be granted for what is alleged in the notice, as per reasons outlined in the Appellant's Statement of Case submitted to the Planning Inspectorate.
