Assessment

The s.211 notification is for the removal of a horse chestnut tree from the front garden of residential property that is situated within the Priory Road Conservation Area.

The large, mature horse chestnut tree is highly visible from the public realm and significantly contributes to character and appearance of the conservation area. The level of public amenity the tree provides is heightened by its front garden position on a crossroad, affording views from many different vantage points including Priory Road, Kilburn Priory, Langtry Road and Belsize Road. The tree has been maintained by crown reduction.

The submission states that the "Tree is close to the front of the house and blocks light to habitable rooms The tree is causing damage to the front boundary wall and the pavement at Priory Road.".

It is considered that the loss of light could be mitigated against through pruning. The tree appears not to have been crown reduced since 2014 or 2015. No evidence has been submitted to support the claims that the tree is causing structural damage.

It is recommended that a tree preservation order be served to protect the character and appearance of the conservation area and the amenity the tree provides.
