I also object to the development, because:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The current line/height of the garage wall is acceptable, largely because we have covered it with plants and hanging decorations of various types. The proposed new heights will completely spoil the sight line, because it is much higher than the existing wall, and will be more difficult to hide. 2. The new wall will also block off a lot more light from the garden. 3. The garden has been lovingly created over 27 years and has won prizes. Extensive works will endanger the trees, and especially the tree Hydrangea (Hydrangea Macrophyllia), which is planted directly against the wall. It has taken 6 years to get it to this state. It will certainly suffer and probably be destroyed by the proposed works. 4. Two of our pet cats are buried against the wall. 5. The development is likely to reduce the value of our house. <p>For all of the above, and taking into account the comments of A A RAY, please reject this application.</p>
2022/1044/P	MR A.A.RAY	10/05/2022 23:50:51	OBJ	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.The proposed development will cut down, significantly, the view to the South West and also will cut down the light which we currently have in the garden 2.The wall that overlooks our garden (section BB. 527/302) has a window. This intrudes upon our privacy 3. We are part of a conservation area. The proposed building will not be in keeping with the existing architecture. 4. Following from No.3(above)if the project is approved, and it is intended to take down the existing wall, it needs to be rebuilt in the same brick. 5. 3 trees are in close proximity to the wall. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Ailantha Altissima (tree of Heaven). Approximately 20 M. high is within 1M of the wall of the existing building. Any excavation will certainly cut through roots, probably adversely affecting the health of the tree, and also increasing the risk of it being blown down onto either No.1 or No.3, given that the prevailing wind is from the South West. This tree has a preservation order on it, and is also a much loved landmark in the area. - Trachycarpus palm, planted in 2015 and now well established, within approximately 1 M of the wall, in the corner closest to the garage door. - Cercis Siliquastrum (Judas tree), approximately 1 M from the wall, between the Tree of heaven and the palm (Items immediately above this) - Hydrangea Macrophyllia (tree Hydrangea) planted directly against the wall and growing up it, covering approximately 1/3 of the wall's surface. The proposed construction would kill it. 6. There is a substantial pond within 1 M of the wall, with many small fish, but also 4 large and valuable Koi Carp. Vibration from the construction could kill all/any of them. <p>I object to this plan. Please reject the application. It is not viewed favourably by us or our neighbours.</p>
