The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

- The proposed permanent shelter, by virtue of its siting, scale and detailed design, would appear as an incongruous and dominant feature that would detract from the character and appearance of the host property, streetscene and St Johns Wood conservation area, contrary to policies D1 (Design), D2 (Heritage) and D3 (Shopfronts) of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
- The proposed permanent shelter, by virtue of its location and size, would reduce the amount of useable and unobstructed public footway, which would cause harm to highway safety, hinder pedestrian movement and have a detrimental impact on the promotion of walking as a sustainable means of transport, contrary to policies A1 (Managing the impact of development), C6 (Access for all) and T1 (Prioritising

walking, cycling and public transport) of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
