Rear Garden: T1: Multi stemmed Bay: Approximately 8.00-9.00m. Reduce crown back to previous most recent growth points, approximately 8.00-9.00m. Thin crown density by 20-25% throughout. Remove dead wood. T2: Tip Fruiting Pear - (right hand boundary): Approximately 5.00m. Reduce extraneous branches back into main crown structure, approximately 1.00m. Thin crown density by 20%. Remove dead wood and broken branches. Reasons: General maintenance and to increase light levels.	
Front Garden:  T3: Mature Willow: Approximately 15.00m. Reduce back to previous and most recent reduction points (approximately1.50-2.00m) whilst preserving a suitable amount of viable furnishing growth in order to ensure crown continuity. Remove dead wood throughout crown. Thin crown density by up to 20%. Raise crown over the road by approximately 2.50m. Remove Ivy from secondary branch structure but retain on lower main stem as a natural habitat.  Reasons: General maintenance.

  - o showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
