Observations Object.

We welcome all efforts to "beautify Belsize Village" and to

keep it clean and tidy.

However, we object to the location of the proposed new

commercial waste Bin Depot and its design.

Its location is too close to all users - passers-by, cyclists, diners, etc. as well as obstructing the pavement (public footpath / right-of-way), it is located in the middle of a public open space, is highly visible along the curved wall of Belsize

Terrace and sits uncomfortably against it.

The proposed screening is poorly designed, incongruous and a brash colour. The two bins proposed are an underestimation of the current and future needs of the eight

restaurants. They overflow daily.

What is needed is a comprehensive plan and design for this space, which so far has evolved over time and to-date has never been designed. Other possible locations for the bins should be explored and evaluated in the real, wider context of Poloizo Villege.

Please provide complete, accurate, to-scale drawings of this entire open space, also highlighting all restaurants from Calici to Charro de Rio to Teta, so that a satisfactory location can be found for the proposed commercial waste depot.

Belsize Village Triangle (square) is too small to be a "North London hub". It is already overcrowded and filled with excessive numbers of planting beds, bicycles, chairs, tables and dated uncomfortable seating.

A comprehensive plan would include a proposal to unify and consider all of these elements, in a space that accommodates all people, not only diners. This would then work towards 'beautifying Belsize Village'
