I do not need to say how this has changed: it is now said to be up for sale for ¿1.5b. I am not suggesting that the intention behind Highline is to make a huge amount of money but bringing in money, regardless of the wishes of residents, becomes paramount after a while. A few years ago I donated a small amount of money to Highline, which then seemed an innocent attempt to build a walkway from Camden Town to King's Cross. It has changed.
