72 firefighters in five hour fight to put out house blaze in Belsize Park

Sunday, 13th March 2016

Ten fire engines and 72 firefighters and officers tackled a house fire in Belsize Park this morning (Sunday).

Nobody was at the property at Antrim Grove at the time of the fire and the London Fire Brigade reported that there were no injuries. Neighbours were safely evacuated with the help of firefighters.

Winston Douglas, from the Brigade, said: "Fire crews have worked really hard to stop fire spreading even further into adjacent properties. Crews installed a fire curtain in the adjoining property. This is a unique situation as they are usually used in theatres and shopping centres to stop fire spreading."
