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I've just made a post at the London Natural History Society forum on Facebook. Unfortunately it's not viewable by everyone but I will add it to my website. I wrote:

Wildflowers spread along the railway line. I was able to observe yellow melilot at Camden Road station (Sept 2018) and I've seen it further along the line day before yesterday (31-5-2022). I also saw zigzag clover just off the railway line near the yellow melilot. The view in the first photo is towards the area that the Camden Highline wants to destroy on the right. I don't know what is there aside from yellow melilot and probably zigzag clover but very concerned about the minimal survey that was completed. I've been trying to find out more (eg when, how many visits, etc). (Camden planning application 2022/2019/P).

Hi Pat & Richard,
Congratulations on your re-election.
I'm afraid I am extremely disappointed and concerned about the planning application that has gone in for the Camden High line.
TRACT raised concerns with CTU regarding security and policing. They intimated that the 'park' would be closed off at dusk which would prevent people accessing the railway line any more than they do now. What they have submitted provides a stair/lift enclosure that appears to assist those intent on climbing up, and a large events space to the rear of Ivor Street and Royal College Street.
Events were never discussed at any consultation I attended or when I have a meeting with CTU to discuss. The intention is to hold 10 events after the park is closed each year and also daytime events. No doubt they will apply for TEN or a licence for that area.
This is completely outrageous and I hope we will have your support in objecting to this as it stands.
There is no information / clarification about how the space will be secure for those using it during opening hours. There seems to be no budget for security. It will become a location for drug dealing, drug taking, drinking, teenagers drinking and playing music from portable speakers. A complete nightmare for those living locally. We already suffer from these activities on the street. This design will provide additional space for anti-social behaviour. I can see no consultation with the Met about how this space will be policed.
