About Camden

Camden is one of the top twenty places in the UK with the highest canopy cover and the Council contributes to this through the management of 28,000 trees with a further 10-15,000 in nature reserves. Trees are recognised by the climate and ecological action plan as essential to combatting combating the effects of climate change and consequently they are essential for making the urban environment liveable now and in the future. The Senior Tree Officer will assist the Tree Manager in keeping the Urban Forest healthy and safe for the residents of Camden through application of our tree policy, tree risk management procedure and planting strategy.

About the role

The Senior Tree Officer will assist the Tree Manager in the management and maintenance of 28,000 Council maintained trees, in line the tree policy, and by doing so allow the Council to discharge it's 'duty of care' and create a sustainable urban forest to the benefit of all Camden residents. This will be done through the day-to-day supervision of Tree Officers, setting out the annual inspection programme and ensuring this is completed on schedule. As well attending to ad hoc enquiries from Council members and the public, through inspections or site meetings.

The role will provide contract monitoring to make sure our contractor is operating in a safe manner, completing work on time and issuing rectification and defect notices. Where specialised arboricultural operations are needed tending and procurement of small contracts in line with Council policy and procedures will be required.

The role will lead on digital improvements and maintenance of Confirm Aboriculture to provide accurate reporting of tree data and finances, and to identify information that could improve the delivery of the service for residents and client departments. This includes analysis and presentation of data for Freedom of Information requests and reports, independently or with the Tree Manager. As well as up-keep of our open data products to keep them relevant to service needs.

The Senior Tree Officer will be expected to be lead officer in the Tree Managers absence and participate in the 24hr emergency call out rota and any evening meetings as required.

About you

- You will hold a level 4 qualification in arboriculture or above with a minimum of 5 years' post qualification experience in the arboricultural industry.
- You will be calm under pressure, able to identify tree risk levels and prioritise work programme accordingly and communicate that to tree officers, contractors, the public, councillors, and emergency services
- Ability to undertake visual tree assessments to identify defects and assess their impact on tree safety and make appropriate recommendations for tree work.
- You will have experience monitoring tree pests & diseases, creating annual management plans and procurement of contracts, specifically, but not limited to oak processionary moth and massaria.
- You will have experience in day-to-day contract supervision, monitoring of works, health & safety, payments, and chairing contract meetings.
- Ability to assist with the councils 24 emergency hour call out system and attendance at evening meetings, as required
- Prepare reports and keep records in relation to tree stock, insurance claims, safety reports and client departments.
- Ability to monitor client department budgets.
- A working knowledge of Confirm Arboriculture and the ability to identify and analyse data to improve service delivery and communicate this to a range of audiences.

Work Environment:

You will be based at 5 Pancras Square, but you will be spending time working outdoors across the borough as duties dictate.

Leading and prioritising tasks completed by 4 Tree Officers Line managing any future apprentices or graduate volunteers.
