My wife and I, both pensioners, [REDACTED], which is my wife's primary residence, and I feel a significant portion of the remainder of our lives will be severely impacted if the GOSH application is approved as submitted.

The GOSH proposal to route construction traffic through Lambs Conduit Street, into Great Ormond Street, and out through Boswell Street is absurd and Camden must reject it.

The amount of congestion, disruption, noise, and pollution that will result over a period of at least 5 years will be intolerable to the residents of this densely populated area, will negatively impact on local businesses, and gravely compromise the safety, health and comfort of the children using the critically important services of Coram's Fields.

A rational alternative solution is apparently readily available: to route the trucks (hopefully electric?) through an archway from Guildford Street into GOSH's own property in Powis Place. Surely, this is the only acceptable way for this development to proceed, and Camden must insist on it.
