The Council has considered your application for prior approval of siting and appearance in respect of the telecommunications equipment described above determines that prior approval is required and hereby **refuses approval** for the following reasons.

## Reason(s) for Objection

The proposed monopole, by reason of its height, bulk, size and alien appearance in this location, would result in overly dominant visual clutter in a prominent position which would cause material harm to the local visual amenity, and be detrimental to the character and appearance of the street scene, local views, and the setting of nearby Heritage Assets including a Grade II listed dwellinghouse at 128 Fortune Green Road, Hampstead Cemetery grade II listed historic open space and 2 nearby grade II listed phones boxes, contrary to policies D1 (Design), D2 (Heritage) and A2 (Open space) of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
