I am writing as managing agent for 47 Arkwright Road, NW3 6BJ. Further to our telephone conversation this morning, please find attached photos of a laburnum tree in the front garden of the property, which is blocking the path and impeding access to the side gate, by which the bins are put out on to the pavement. More importantly, it is putting heavy pressure on the boundary wall and piers adjacent to the pavement, as well as that with the neighbouring property, already causing some damage, which can only get worse and could be a danger to a passer-by.

While it is never a good thing to remove a tree, we believe that this is required in these circumstances. I attach also a quote from Harrison's Tree Service, who have recommended the tree's removal.

Please could you advise if permission can be given as we would like to carry out this work as a matter of urgency.
