· Void beneath slab

- Rainwater will be harvested from the roof of the outbuilding. Rainwater pipes will be routed to underneath the floor slab.
- The rainwater pipes underneath the floor slab will be perforated to allow for the roots to be watered.

• Void underneath the slab will be ventilated.

All of the above will be as per building control regulations.

Any further detail than this will require us to appoint a structural engineer and this seems excessive considering the size of the building and it being at the planning stage.

If necessary could you just put a planning condition for the structural details of the floor build up?

Morning Mirsad,

Hope you are well. The tree officer has responded and would like further clarification (see below);

ΥΠ Two trees, T2 and T3 are proposed to be removed from the rear garden in order to facilitate development. Both trees are of low visibility from the public realm and are not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area. However, the DAS states that "The proposal will not remove

any of the existing mature trees to the rear of the garden, which are integral and in harmony with the proposed design." As a result can you please clarify.

TIT The arb. impact assessment states that the footprint of the outbuilding cover >20% of the root protection area of T6, a sycamore tree that is to be retained. The same doc. states that there should be a void between the structure and the soil to allow for gaseous exchange and for rainwater to be harvested from the roof and return to the soil below. This is not shown on proposed drawings and could result in an increase in ultimate height if added as an afterthought. As a result please amend the proposed drawings to show this minor but important amendment.
