Replacement of timber and Crittall framed single glazed sash windows at 2nd and 3rd floor levels with timber framed, double glazed sash windows on Harrison Street and Seaford Street elevations.

Condition(s) and Reason(s):

1 The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans: (228021-FCG-ST-XX-DR-B-1000-S4-P01; (228021-FCG-MB-EL-DR-B-)2200-S4-P02, 2400-S4-P01, 2401-S4-P01, 2402-S4-P01; Design & Access Statement from Frankham Consultancy Group Ltd. (ref. 228021-FCG-XX-XX-RP-B-0432-S2-P01) dated April 2022.

Reason:

For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policy D1 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting planning permission:

The proposed replacement windows at 2nd and 3rd floor levels would match as closely as possible the existing windows in terms of materials, colour, design, opening methods and proportions. Some existing Crittall framed windows would be altered to timber framed units which is considered to be an appropriate change for this building in terms of both design and material, particularly as it is noted as being the traditional material for windows at the property. Additionally, the proposal would result in a more balanced appearance given that the replacements would align more closely in design terms with existing windows at 1st floor level and some remaining windows at 2nd floor level.

There would be some degree of increased thickness to the frames/glazing bars in order to accommodate the double glazing panes; however, in this instance, the use of suitably designed slim-line units are considered to be an appropriate and sympathetic change which would preserve the character and appearance of the host building and wider terrace.

In sustainability terms, double glazed units are noted as having the potential to reduce energy costs, provide more thermal efficiency and insultation, offset the need for powered heating and so reduce carbon emissions, and allow for passive flow of ventilation (through trickle vents).

There are no amenity concerns as the proposed windows would replace existing windows.

The site's planning and appeals history has been taken into account when coming to this decision. No objections have been received following statutory consultation.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies A1, D1 and CC1 of

the Camden Local Plan 2017, the London Plan 2021 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2021.
