We presume the new equipment will cause even more problems for us.</p> <p>The present equipment on the roof and tower look totally out of place in this historic area. They ruin the look of the tower altogether. Surely they would be better placed on the roof of the much higher buildings in Granary Square or the roof of the new 22 - storey monstrosity Grand Central Apartments, currently under construction on a public green space. Unfortunately everything gets dumped in Somers Town.
