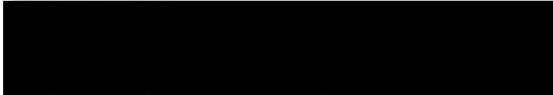

Objection: 2022/2255

I am Ukrainian refugee who will be living at 5 Queen Square with my 5 year old son Andrii for the next few years.

I am very worried about the plans by Great Ormond Street Hospital.

The scheme is totally wrong for a Conservation Area.

However, my biggest worry is that I understand that the hospital plans for THOUSANDS of 30 ton lorries to go up and down the small residential streets of Lamb Conduit Street, Great Ormond Street and Queen Square. There will be many 30 ton lorries every hour - IN SCHOOL HOURS.

This creates a HUGE danger for the many children who live in the area, or walk to and from school, as well as the thousands of kids who come to the hospital every month.

The lorries must stay on a major road, like a B-Road, surely, to protect the children.

So please can the scheme be changed to keep the lorries away from the children?

Or there will be terrible accidents for sure.

If you allow this access plan to go through children will be killed, and it will look very bad for the Hospital and for Camden Council - as everyone is very aware of these risks. There have been too many deaths on Camden's roads already.

It doesn't seem like the plans have taken into account the children, which is wrong.
