Scope of consultation

- 1.1 The above application relates to the development of four buildings, three representing relevant buildings, ranging between 19.8 m and 33.3 m. Each building is served by a single stair that represents the escape stair as well as the firefighting stair.
- 1.2 It is noted that, at the ground floor, every building contains ancillary areas such as refuse store, cycle store, as well as commercial areas.



1.3 HSE welcomes the proposed design to have access to these areas only from the outside and to ensure no connection with the single stair, as per the current fire safety standard recommendation.
