Once again I would like to point out that I am extremely concerned about the disruption, noise and dirt which will be created by this project and these should be kept to a minimum.

I am objecting to the extension at the back of the project because that fact will diminish our privacy as it will be possible to overlook our balconies and gardens from there. I am also concerned about the loss of daylight into my various windows which are merely a couple of meters distanced from No. 61.

Furthermore I am objecting to the extension at the back as it will involve excavating a basement and this fact will disturb the water table underground. I believe there is an underground stream running under the area in question, our garden gets flooded quite frequently in rainy weather and this would obviously only get worse should there be any more obstruction to the way the groundwater circulates.

Consequently, I very strongly object to the application being granted without the plans being adjusted.
