Whilst the sitself lies just outside the CA it forms the context for longer views into and out of the CA and the location is within the setting of the Grade II Listed Mornington Crescent houses immediately adjacent. Critically the northern parapet of Granby Terrace bridge is seen within the wider context of the Camden Cutting walls to lead to the Park Street Tunnels and form the backdrop to the Listed houses on Mornington Terrace and Five Village East (Grade II*), thus affecting the Regents Park Conservation Area in addition. Railway infrastructure that is immediately visible to pedestrians needs to be of the highest quality, both in materiality and for visual amenity. This is something that the HS2 Design Review Panel recognises and in Network Rail proposals need to be in conformity with that approach. The CTCAAC considers that the use of GRP panels neither preserves nor enhances the Conservation Area and would be unaccentable for this reason.
