London Historic Environment Record and/or made available in connection with this application, I conclude that the proposal is unlikely to have a significant effect on heritage assets of archaeological interest.

The historic vaults at the front of the listed building are to be lowered by c. 1m. However, these vaults have already been tanked and plastered over and therefore their archaeolgoical interest has been reduced. No other parts of the redevelopment will have an archaeological impact.

No further assessment or conditions are therefore necessary.
