I am writing on behalf of the Delancey Street Residents Association to object to Planning Application No: 2019/3522/P. I am conscious that the online objections deadline has now passed, please accept my apologies but this application has only just been brought to our attention.

The erection of marquees and increase in customers will only add to the noise and anti-social behaviour that residents living within the proximity of the premises already suffer on a regular basis. In addition to noise, we have had several incidents where bottles have been left at resident's properties, glass smashed in the street, people sitting on resident's steps drinking and urination in the street. Given the very large increase in projected customer numbers related to the application, this is only likely to get worse for residents.

The proposed management plan is inadequate. Given the projected customer numbers, staffing and security provision will not prevent the above happening, and it is hard to see how such customer numbers could be managed within the residential environment in which the premises are located.

By adding additional structures you will be increasing the number of customers and the noise for residents will have a great impact on them. Regardless of what time the marquee shuts the noise in the pub and garden as well as when they leave will be considerable. The security are unable to deal with customers leaving with bottles so the situation is only going to get worse. Many residents on Delancey Street and the surrounding area have children and will be disturbed by the noise from customers.

In short, the premises do not manage the nuisance they create presently so this application should be rejected as it will surely be a torrid World Cup for local residents if this application is granted.
