				The tree is in excellent health, frequently maintained, and was there at least 50 years before the Auden Place development. The Victorian garden wall that runs much closer to the tree than Auden Place shows no major cracks. If there is a problem at Auden Place, the insurers should ask the architects why they did not design adequate foundations that allowed for the presence of existing trees.
				I note that the arboricultural assessment only suggests felling if the tree cannot be properly maintained (section 4.1), which is not an issue here.
				The engineer's report, which excludes "structural inadequacy or building defect", says the level of damage is "slight". Under cause of damage, it states that " damage has occurred due to clay shrinkage subsidence. This has been caused by moisture extraction by roots" Then, under heave assessment, it states " no dessication has been found the clay subsoil has rehydrated and equilibrium moisture content has returned." In other words, nothing more than the usual seasonal changes.
