Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works  Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

This is light Tree maintenance works to manage the trees and to remove two self seeded poorly located specimens.

- T1 Thuya by entrance of gate Appears sound Natural dieback in crown Remove dead wood over 2" in diameter. Raise the low branches to give clearance of approx 4m over bench and new box hedges to allow greater light into that area whilst retaining natural arch affect
- T2 Laurel hedge Garden side hedge creating good screening but taking over a large section of the lawn. Reducing it in laterally to the shed by approx 4m. This will open up the shrub area and make it more bare and open to the roadside but should re-grown well and allow more lawn space. Retain height.
- T3 Self seeded Sycamore in Laurel hedge. Wrong location. Fell and poison
- G1 x2 Cherry tree choked with ivy ivy is killing the Cherry trees Remove ivy florets and sever vines at base. This will leave the tree looking very bare for a while but should send out shoots that will help the tree to live. Prune to shape remaining tree by reducing the crown to live growth by approx 1.5m.
- T4 Large Ash tree by compost Remove creeper from tree. Remove Dead wood over 2" in diameter. Crown thin by 15%. Do not reduce height or over all shape of Tree.
- T6 Large Ash tree by wall Remove ivy from tree Raise the crown removing low branches to crown break at approx 5m. Do not reduce height or over all shape of Tree Dead wood
- T7 Yew Tree Raise the crown to approx 3m from ground level to give more room to walk beneath tree.
- T8 Leaning Apple tree Crown thin by 25% and crown reduce by approx 1.5m
- T9 Apple tree Remove snapped section reduce height by approx 1.5m and thin by 10%
- T10 Self seeded Ash tree growing between Apple and Holly over neighbours wrong location Fell to ground level
