Existing cork lining is to be replaced with more sympathetic renovation.


## 2. Utility Room.

The contemporary fit out is to be stripped out to allow for new cabinets and a new utility room layout.


Where the internal layout is to be rearranged all the original architectural mouldings are to be faithfully replicated.

Existing roof lanterns to be refurbished and retained.





Contemporary kitchen to be stripped out to make way for new fit out.


5. Existing hall cupboard doors.

Doors and section of internal wall to be removed and retained for reuse to allow for the new kitchen.

Where the internal layout is to be rearranged all original architectural mouldings are to be faithfully replicated.

# 6. Existing double doors between kitchen and hall.

Section of partition wall to be demolished to allow for new kitchen. Architectural mouldings are none original throughout kitchen and dining area due to the renovation and extension in the 90s.

Existing opening to be widenned to allow for double doors.


The original architraves are to be faithfully replicated and the doors and door furniture are to reused. New architrave and solid door to match existing like for like.

Carefully rehung in existing frame. Ensuring no damage to existing architectural mouldings or existing door.

# 8. Existing living room cabinetry.

Allow for strip out of contemporary fitted cabinets.







# 14. Bathroom Roof light.


Small roof light and exposed roof rafters removed to allow for new internal





Bathroom door together with door furniture, architrave and frame is relocated to allow for new layout.\*


## 21. Architectrural Mouldings

Door between bedrooms is to be infilled.\*


## 25. Bedroom 2 entrance door








Stair to be repaired where damaged and to take new stair carpet runner.













31/34. Existing Bathroom fit out Contemporary bathroom to be stripped out to make way for new fit out.
