It has come to my attention that planning permission has been granted to Ms. Anne Gruenwaelder joint freeholder of flat 117B Gaisford street, to extend her property.

I have now seen the plans for the first time and the formal notice of this planning application by Camden Council Planning Office.

Firstly I would like to draw reference to the fact that I like Alice was never given formal notice of this planning application by Camden Council Planning Office, and were therefore was not given the opportunity to object to this application.

Decision Letter date 20 October 2021 sent to Camden Council's Daniel Pope Chief Planning Officer sited:

1 Reasons for granting permission:

"No objections have been raised in relation to the application. Neutral comments from a resident and Kentish Town Neighbourhood forum have been taken into account. There is an existing relationship in terms of overlooking and potential for noise"

I would like to comment that since Anne has moved in, I have had to put up curtains for the first time for privacy and noise levels on occasions on the terrace have been loud I have not made and formal or informal complaint about this with her. I have also been informed by my neighbour Mr Martin Congo (he is severely disabled) of the proposed plans, he too objects as currently his privacy had been comprised with people peering into his kitchen and lower bed room from the existing terrace and believes that this will continue and is worried about any more restriction to light or shadow to his view,

have enjoyed the view from my kitchen window, this purposed plan with cause me visual amenity, extreme loss of light ( further lack of privacy and noise disturbance nearby bedroom should the plan be granted).

It appears to me that the legal process has not been followed and to date there have been no replies to Alice's emails sent August 8<sup>th</sup> 2022, detailing her objections and concerns.

To confirm I totally object to this planning permission Application ref: 2021/0903/P
