Welcome/Introduction

Mary's serves young people at risk of school exclusion, involvement in violence, and involvement in the criminal justice system. We dominantly operate within Camden and take young people on trips within London. Three times a year plan residentials which are outside of London.

Future developments

We currently have 300 young people and have 13 staff, which will increase to 500 young people and 16 staff with our proposed expansion. We have on site bike racks for 8 cycles – with plenty of space for additional storage facilities. This could easily be increased if necessary.

As detailed in our Design and Access Statement for this planning application, we have conducted a travel survey, which is included in this document. Young people access the service directly, we do not have parent and carer travel considerations as there is not pick up and drop off.

Extended use of the youth centre and Travel Issues

We currently store scooters inside the facilities for young people, we do not have an outside store. Due to the low volumes of individuals at any one time using this option we forsee that this will continue in the developed site. On site cycle racks are permanently available. The youth centre is highly served by public transport, 10 minutes walk to the Northern Line at Chalk Farm or the Jubilee Line at Swiss Cottage. Many bus routes are within 5 minutes walk: 31, 274, 168, N28, N31, N5. A bit further on Finchley Road within 15 minutes walk are London Overground stops, and the 13, 113, 187, 268 and N113 bus routes.



Description of the locality of the Nursery

Mary's youthwork shares the same site as St. Mary the Virgin Primrose Hill and St. Pauls' C of E Primary School. We are based at the intersection of King Henry's Road, Primrose Hill Road and Elsworthy Road. The current site has three entrance doors, the improvements to the site will provide improved entrances and signage with a clearly allocated door on to Primrose Hill Road for Mary's youthwork.

There is not a singular opening and closing time and the sessions with young people are in one to one or small groups, therefore the flow of individuals is small at any one time. There is no drop off or pick up element and so individuals using the service make their way directly to us.

There are good access pathways from all directions, from the South through Primrose Hill Royal Park; East to West on Kings Henry's Road and Adelaide Road; and North on Primrose Hill Road. There are crossing points on the four way crossing on Adelaide Road and a zebra crossing by St. Paul's School. A pedestrian island and crossing point exists on the East End of St. Mary The Virgin Primrose Hill church.

Travel Issues

There are established routes to travel in a variety of public transport forms. The dominant travel issues in the local area are the high impact of the HS2 development which has impacted on capacity of the roads locally (being centred on Adelaide Road) as well as the number of heavier goods vehicles. Additionally the area has been having high levels of utilities works to roads which has meant extensive road closures. The disruption is scheduled to continue for another four years.

Objectives and Targets

- 1.0 Improve bicycle storage externally: provide increased capacity and all weather appropriate shelter for bicycles with greater safety level for the bicycles being stored.
- 2.0 Ensure good shower facilities continued in new building
- 3.0 Have locked space or secure space available for clothes/helmets in new building to encourage active transport
