Assessment

The s.211 notification is for the removal of an ash tree and a poplar tree from the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Belsize Park Conservation Area.

The poplar tree is visible from the public realm from Eton Avenue and provides amenity to the public. The tree contributes to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The poplar tree forms part of a green corridor which extend along the rear gardens of Fellows Road and Eton Avenue, which is considered to be an important landscape feature and provide habitat.

There are at least six primary schools within 500m of the tree. The tree provides a valuable function of helping to combat air pollution which is of particular importance for children.

The notification alleges that the trees are contributing to vegetation related property damage. However, the information submitted is considered inconclusive; the level monitoring data does not show seasonal and therefore vegetation-related movement and there are damaged drained identified in the drainage survey which could be causing the damage.

It is recommended that a tree preservation order be served to protect the amenity the poplar tree provides and the character and appearance of the conservation area. The ash tree is supressed by the neighbouring poplar and copper beech tree and is considered less significant and of lower public visibility than the poplar.

It is recommended that the notification be part granted and part refused.
