Trees around Summit Lodge Cottage (T1-T5)

- T1) Sycamore: Reduce lateral growth over property by up to 2.5 metres to provide 1.5 metres clearance.
- T2) Sycamore: Reduce lateral growth over property by up to 2.5 metres to provide 1.5 metres clearance.
- T3) Mature Sycamore: Reduce lateral growth over property by up to 2.5 metres to provide 1.5 metres clearance.
- T4) Apple: Crown lift to 2 metres; reduce away from property.
- T5) Gleditsia in centre of lawn area: Crown lift to 2 metres.

T6-T11: Row of semi-mature trees underneath row of mature specimen trees on the boundary with the Heath Extension. The smaller trees are stunted and disproportionate due to the shade cast by the mature trees and may never develop a balanced form. I am proposing that these trees are removed to open up the view of the larger mature trees behind them.

- T6) Small Cherry tree on rear boundary: Disproportionate form and spread over the garden; stunted growth potential: Remove to ground level.
- T7) Self-seeded Sycamore in front of Mature Sycamore and Horse Chestnut: Disproportionate form and spread over the garden: stunted growth potential: Remove to ground level.
- T8) Semi-mature Beech tree: Remove to ground level.
- T9) Rowan: Remove to ground level.
- T10) Prunus: Remove to ground level.
- T11) Atlas Cedar next to pond: this tree has a disproportionate and stunted form due to the close proximity of the adjacent trees. The tree is semi-mature and has potential to develop a broad and tall form with corresponding root system. It is my opinion that this tree has been planted in the wrong position and should be removed before causing damage to the pond: Remove to ground level.
- T12) Gleditsia: Reduce overall crown by up to 2 metres to provide tidy and consistent form.
- T13) Beech tree on rear boundary: 20% volume reduction (by thinning and drop-crotching, secondary growth only) to provide more light to the garden area and tidier and consistent shape. Overall crown reduction by up to 2.5 metres.
- T14) Mature Ash on boundary with Heath Extension: Overall crown reduction by up to 2.5 metres. Retain even and flowing canopy outline.
- T15) Mature Sycamore on boundary with Heath Extension: Overall crown reduction by up to 2.5 metres. Retain even and flowing canopy outline.
- T16) Mature Horse Chestnut on boundary with Heath Extension: Overall crown reduction by up to 2.5 metres. Retain even and flowing canopy outline.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- indicate the main features of the site where the tree(s) stand and its surroundings; in particular, you should:
 - o mark and name surrounding roads
 - sketch in buildings, including adjoining properties
 - add house numbers or names
- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
 - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
 - o showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
