I am writing to you to object to the appalling development plan at One Museum Street. I agree with every word of the Campaign to block this plan. Museum Street is part of a very attractive conservation area which was saved from demolition in the 1970s.

As a long time resident of Covent Garden, I and all other residents have endured years of noise and disruption from endless property developments. Scaffolding. Demolition. Drilling. Dust. The aggravation and impact on quality of life goes on and on. Currently there are two massive redevelopments on Endell Street. The noise will have continued for years by the time the conversions are completed. Residents living in the vicinity of One Museum Street will suffer too if planning is granted.

Property developers don't care about residents. And neither it seems do they care if a great lump of a building, needlessly taller than at present, looms over an area that is bordered by Hawksmoor's St George's Church and the British Museum and is unique in character and atmosphere. The planned design of One Museum Street is nothing less than a visual insult to the area.
