This mature Chestnut is in terminal decline with a large rotten cavity at the crutch of the tree. The owner has applied to crown reduce it in order to extend its life and make it structurally more safe and sound. I do not object to this, but do not know how many years it will survive.

The following four applications relate to the York Rise Estate.

I was not able to obtain access to the rear garden Winfrede Paul House and could only view from Spencer Rise and the railway bridge.

2022/4532/T. Newcomen House I do not object to the crown reduction of the Plum tree (No 960)

2022/4533/T. Stephenson House No objection to crown reducing the three Magnolias (Nos 951, 1609 and 1839).

2022/4538/T. Brunel House No objection to the crown lifting of the Silver Birch in the car park at rear.

2022/4539/T. Winifrede Paul House No objection to the overgrown Beech hedge reduction (Nos 1943, 1945, 1946 and 1947). No objection to trimming the Yew (No 1616) if it is obstructing the footpath. (I was unable to view it).

No objection to the work on the Magnolia (No 1938) or the Laburnum (No 1940).

No objection to the felling of the Elder (No 1939) as it is in the middle of the Beech 'hedge'.

There is one large tree by the railway line which is covered in ivy. If this is the Wild Cherry, (No 1941) then no objection to severing the Ivy.

There is also a conifer, at the rear of Brunel House by the railway line, and near to the children's playground, which needs its ivy severed too.

2022/4572/T. Heath View No objection to the proposed work on this Silver Birch tree.
