1) Sketch plan - position of sycamore tree "T1" on the rear boundary wall of 36 Frognal (relative to other trees in the car park area of 36 Frognal - note no work is being undertaken to the x2 lime trees at the side of car park).

2) Copy of previous (lapsed) Section 211 notice of intended works to fell sycamore tree (T1) (and holly tree which was felled) - Application Ref: 2014/3297/T.

3) Copy letter from Camden dated 10 June 2014 confirming no objection to Section 211 works notified under Application Ref: 2014/3297/T. (Only holly tree was felled. Approval has lapsed in respect of sycamore tree (T1)).

4) Photos of sycamore tree and temporary hazard fencing erected in 36 Frognal's car park to safeguard against collapse of unstable boundary wall adjacent to sycamore tree.

5) Close up photos of severe cracks - vertical and horizontal - and arching of rear boundary brick retaining wall. The cracks have significantly enlarged in the last month.

# Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

Sycamore tree - marked as "T1" on the attached sketch plan. Application to fell to ground, removing stump and roots by glycophosphate (or other suitable method) as the tree roots are causing increased subsidence to the rear boundary retaining wall between 36 Frognal and 43 and 45A Netherhall Gardens, which presents a hazard to those properties and their occupants. Temporary safety fencing has been erected as a precaution.

This is a self-seeded poor specimen of a sycamore tree with a bifurcated trunk located next to/with roots spreading under the rear boundary retaining wall. The tree also has a noticeable lean forward at an angle of approximately 30 degrees into 36 Frognal. It is approximately 30m high and too close to the rear boundary wall, which is a retaining wall (retaining approximately 2m depth of soil) of the gardens of the neighbouring properties (43 and 45A Netherhall Gardens).

You will see from the attached photos that a natural arch has formed in the top line of bricks along the wall from three tree roots pushing up. This was first evident in August 2022 along with significant vertical and horizontal cracks in the wall. In the last month, the existing vertical crack to the right of the sycamore has significantly widened as has the horizontal crack and a new wide vertical crack has appeared on the left of the sycamore tree.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
  - marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
  - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
