The decision in that case states that:</p> <p>'The tree is considered a good example of its species with no significant defects visible from ground level. The tree appears to be in good condition both structurally and physiologically with a significant safe useful life expectancy.</p> <p>The tree provides screening between properties, protecting the privacy of residents.</p> <p>The tree is yet to reach its ultimate size and form and has the space to achieve those as it is at the back of the rear garden away from buildings.'</p> <p>Those statements all continue to be correct. There is no reason to reduce the size of this tree. This property is directly behind my property and, due to its dense evergreen crown, the tree provides screening which protects us against light pollution from the houses in Boscastle Road and protects our privacy.</p> <p>I also object to the works to the beech tree (T8). This is a beautiful, well shaped tree which, again provides screening against the light pollution from the houses in Boscastle Road.</p>
