My name is Liz Gannon. My husband Iain

We have owned our home here since 2013 and are active in our neighborhood community. I wanted to raise our objections to the planning application for building the mansard extension at Howitt Close.

Simply stated, I think the proposed works cause a tremendous amount of undue stress for all involved, for the benefit of a very few.

Howitt Close is a building of architectural significance, and a change of the nature proposed is not in keeping with the style of the neighborhood, and sets a poor precedent for protecting the look and feel of the neighborhood as it pertains to future applications.

These proposed works cause a lot of stress to the current residents of Howitt Close, rendering them all but homeless for the duration of the works.

The extension will even impact those living on Glenloch, Glenmore and Glenilla with all the sights, sounds and traffic brought on by a project of this nature.

The neighborhood has undergone a fair amount of inconvenience at the hands of the council and private construction projects - from the nonstop demolition and rebuilding on Glenilla to tearing up and re-structuring Haverstock Hill to accommodate bike lanes.

I am hard pressed to believe that subjecting the residents of Howitt Close as well as the members of the local community to this work is worth seven additional residences.
