T1 is a approximate 12m sycamore very close the the corner the the clients house. We are wishing to pollard the tree to 8m so that routine maintenance can be carried out on the tree in the future so it will not ever get as big as it has next to the house.

T2 is a very large sycamore that has previously been pollarded to 8m. Again this is very close to the house. We would to pollard to the previous points.

T3 is another sycamore. As this tree is not so near the house but is closer to where my clients driveway is. We would like to carry out a 1m reduction, deadwood and remove the dead ivy from within the tree.

T4 is a much smaller sycamore but the are 3 long limb that are growing over her boundary fence and into the communal gardens. We would like to reduce the 3 limbs to rebalance the crown and avoid any future damage to the fence or communal gardens.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

 - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
 - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - $\circ\;$ adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
