



**Plan legend**


Explanation of category grading as per the Cascade chart included as table 1 in the BS5837:2012 document.

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Category 'A'

Trees of high quality and value, which are worthy of retention and a high level of protection. These trees will need to be retained and measures undertaken to ensure they are not impacted upon by the development.
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Category 'B'

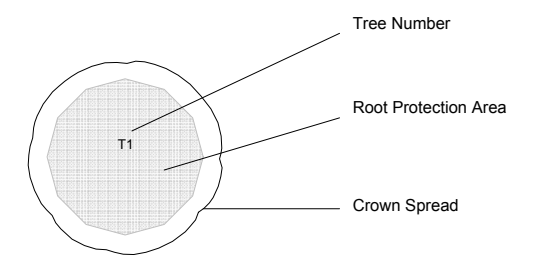
Trees of moderate quality and value, which are worthy of retention and protection. These trees should be retained where possible within the proposed development and where necessary designs altered to accommodate them. However, they should not be retained at the cost of a category 'A' tree.
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Category 'C'

Trees of low quality and value. These trees should only be retained where they do not pose a considerable constraint on the development. Where retained they will require tree protection.
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Category 'U'

Trees which have been identified as requiring removal for reason of sound arboricultural management.



Root Protection Area - This is a layout design tool which indicates the minimum rooting environment around a tree, deemed sufficient to maintain a trees viability.
