**Local Planning Authority reference: 2022/5313/P**

I refer to your letter received by the GLA on 07 December 2022 consulting the Mayor of London on the above planning application, under the terms of the Mayor of London Order 2008.

The applicant proposes: Variation of conditions 2 (approved drawings) and 46 (unit numbers) of planning permission 2019/4140/P granted 14/07/2021 which itself varied planning permission 2015/6455/P dated 23rd June 2017 for: Comprehensive redevelopment following demolition of all existing buildings to provide self-contained residential dwellings (Class C3), flexible non-residential use (Class A-A3, D1, D2), employment floorspace (Class B1) and community meeting space (Class D1) in buildings ranging from 3 to 7 storeys. New vehicular access from West End Lane and provision of accessible car parking spaces. Provision of new public open space and widening of Potteries Path and associated cycle parking and landscaping; NAMELY, a reduction of 2 market flats following the amalgamation of units.


I have assessed the details of the application and, given the scale and nature of the proposals, conclude that the amendments do not give rise to any new strategic planning issues.

Therefore, under article 5(2) of the above Order the Mayor of London does not need to be consulted further on this application. Your Council may, therefore, proceed to determine the application without further reference to the GLA. I will be grateful, however, if you would send me a copy of any decision notice and section 106 agreement.
