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1 Introduction

2 Schedule of Existing flat entrance doors

Location	Description	Photographic examples
Nigel House.	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor and upper concrete walkways. Of 48 doors, none appear to be original.	
Buckbridge House.	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor and internal access corridors. Of 30 doors, 5 appear to be original. These are represented by the first and second image.	

Location	Description	Photographic examples
Kirkeby House.	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor, external concrete walkways and internal access corridors. Based upon the available 1909 image contained within the main report, none of the doors within this block appear to be original.	<image/>
Redman House.	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor, external concrete walkways and internal access corridors. Of 82 doors, approximately 13 appear to be original or altered originals. These are represented by the first and second photos.	<image/>

Location	Description	Photographic examples
Laney House	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor, external concrete walkways and internal access corridors. Of 41 doors, none appear to be original.	<image/>
Shene House	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor and external concrete walkways. Of 17 doors, 5 appear to be original or altered originals. These are represented by the second and third photographs.	<image/>

Radcliffe House	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor, external concrete walkways and internal access corridors. Of 61 doors, none appeared to be original.	<image/>
Skipwith House	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor and external concrete walkways. Of 30 doors, none appeared to be original.

Denys House.	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor and external concrete walkways. Of 30 doors, 5 appear to be original or altered originals. These are represented by the first and second images.	<image/>
Ledam House	Flat entrance doors are set out across the ground floor and external concrete walkways. Of 34 doors, 5 appear to be original or altered originals. These are represented by the first image.
